The Five Themes of Geography

1. Location

Where is it? Why is it located there?



- Absolute location is given in degrees of latitude and longitude.
- Relative location depends upon point of reference, e.g., near, far, a short drive.

2. Place

What is it like?

 <u>Physical Characteristics</u> - landforms (mountains, plains, etc.), bodies of water (oceans, lakes, bay, etc.), ecosystems (soil, plants, animals, and climate)




- Human Characteristics bridges, roads, buildings, culture, language
 All places have features that distinguish them from other places.

- Depend on the environment
- Adapt to the environment
- Modify the environment

4. Movement





- Transportation, communication, trade
- Patterns of movement such as migration


